How To Be Rich

Our culture is obsessed with being rich. A good question to ask is, “What does it mean to be rich?” For some of us, “rich” would mean having more than what we currently have. For others, rich would be having more than what you need.

But looking at the average incomes for people around the world, the vast majority of Americans are in the top 1% of income earners worldwide. So most likely, we all are already rich, and we didn’t even know it. I imagine many of us would respond by saying to ourselves, “But I don’t feel rich.”

All of this leads to a really good question: How can we do a good job at being rich? How can we marshal what God has entrusted to us in such a way that we have the experience of true abundance? According to the apostle Paul, this is something that we can learn. He wrote:

Command those who are rich in this present world not to be arrogant nor to put their hope in wealth, which is so uncertain, but to put their hope in God, who richly provides us with everything for our enjoyment. Command them to do good, to be rich in good deeds, and to be generous and willing to share. In this way they will lay up treasure for themselves as a firm foundation for the coming age, so that they may take hold of the life that is truly life. (1 Timothy 6:17-19)

Being truly rich is a matter of the heart even more than a matter of a bank balance. It involves placing our trust in God instead of material wealth, and in generously giving to others, so that we can build up treasure in heaven, something Jesus calls us to do as well (Matthew 6:20).

Over the month of November, we’ll be using this passage from 1 Timothy as a launching point to discover how we can truly be rich!

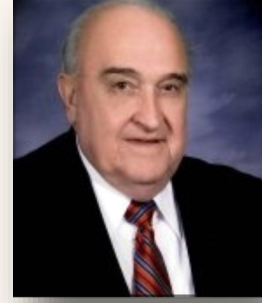

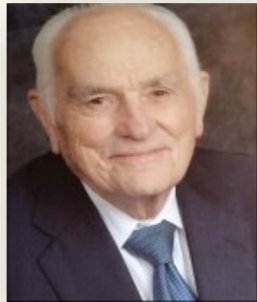

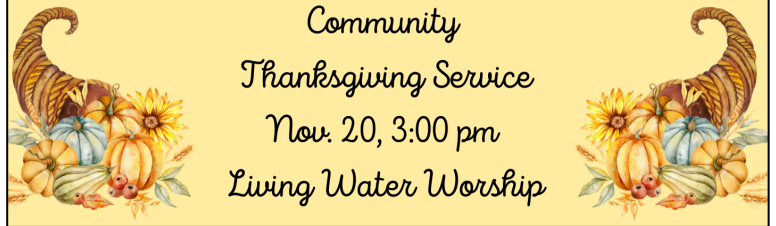


Help us pack a shoebox for a child in need!
