My hope is that, in the end, we will all see more clearly how the story of Jesus' passion, abandonment, and eventual resurrection remains the greatest hope for a hurting world.

The following is an article I wrote for our church newsletter 5 years ago. I happened upon it recently and thought I would share these words again. They apply just as much today as they did 5 years ago.

Happy New Year! Each new year grants us refreshed opportunities to review our life paths. What a perfect time to consider our spiritual walk and the choices we make. Many of us make decisions to increase our prayer time, engage in more bible study, commit to more readily sharing our faith in our daily lives, take a more active role in

our church events, increase our financial support to our church, participate in multiple missions outreach, to name a few. Like many other new year's resolutions, our intent is good; but do we really follow through with actions to enhance our spiritual walk? Do I? Do you? Reflecting on these options, how can we make them happen? Thoughts...

- 1. Increase our prayer time: Are you on the FUMC prayer warrior email list? If not, contact the church office and ask to be included. That action alone provides you with prayer needs which might prompt you to increase your praying.
- **2.** Engage in more bible study: These studies are available through "Sunday School" classes, Wednesday night studies, ladies circles, and other small group studies. Another option is to check out a book from the church library. Or maybe commit to reading the bible or a devotional each day.
- 3. Sharing our faith in our daily lives: Of course, considering WWJD as we go about our daily activities allows us to share our faith by example. Speaking about our faith takes this to a different level and requires that we make conscious efforts to open doors to spiritual conversation. Simply sharing our church affiliation, perhaps inviting someone to a special service, commenting about a church event, or sharing an inspirational posting on Facebook can open these doors.
- **4.** Take a more active role in our church events: Search the weekly church bulletin and the FUMC monthly newsletter for church activities. Review the bulletin boards on the first floor and in fellowship hall. Check out the FUMC website and Facebook pages. Make a commitment to participate in more of the activities listed. Or perhaps even develop new activities that would benefit you and others.
- **5. Increase financial support to our church**: Consider paying your tithe via scheduled on-line check payments through your bank. It's easy, plus it's an easy way to never forget a tithe payment when you are absent from church.
- **6. Participate in missions**: Keep in the know on missions projects and join in however you can. All of our church small groups are involved in various service ministries. December was busy with service and donations for the Shoe box Ministry, Christmas for Learning Tree residents, Pregnancy Center, House of Love and Mercy, Hospice, to name a few. Jumping to this current year, we now have an ongoing churchwide ministry of the Tallassee Mission House, a ministry in which everyone in our church has an opportunity to be involved in. Are you "on a mission"? How are you showing God's love by being the hands and feet of Jesus?
