# <u>Renewal</u>

Our theme for the summer is renewal. During the month of June, our Wednesday night events will be focused on both fun and fellowship, as well as renewing our relationship with Jesus Christ. You can see the page further in the newsletter with more details.

How is it that we experience renewal of our faith? I recently encountered this passage from Tim Keller:

Gospel renewal is a life-changing recovery of the gospel. Personal gospel renewal means the gospel doctrines of sin and grace are *actually experienced*, not just known intellectually. This personal renewal includes an awareness and conviction of one's own sin and alienation from God and comes from seeing in ourselves deeper layers of self-justification, unbelief, and self-righteousness than we have ever seen before. There is a new, commensurate grasp of the wonder of for-giveness and grace as we shed these attitudes and practices and rest in Christ alone for salvation. Perhaps we have previously said that we were "resting in Christ's work, not our own work" for salvation, but when we experience gospel renewal, we *have a new clarity about what this means* in our mind and a *new experience* of actually doing it with our heart. Tim Keller, "Center Church" (emphasis mine)

Renewal happens when the truths of the gospel move from something we know in our heads to something that we experience in a new and deeper way. That experience of the salvation Jesus gives isn't something we can force, but it is something that we be in a position to experience when God moves in our lives.

#### MISSION HOUSE OBSERVATIONS: COINCIDENCE? PROVIDENCE? MIRACLES?

While working the Mission House recently, I had just spoken these words out loud to my volunteer partner: "We are out of pots and pans and need some for a few of our visitors". No more than 30 seconds later, the door bell to the Mission House rang and I opened the door to find Kathy Butler there to donate a complete set of lightly used pots and pans!

A woman in her sixties arrived at the Mission House to say she would be receiving custody of a relative's twin premature babies as soon as they would be released from the hospital. She was in great need of newborn supplies, as she would be getting not one, but TWO newborns and needed to prepare quickly. We prayed that God would provide for their needs, and give her the strength she would need to raise the babies within the family. She left that day feeling blessed with a stroller, newborn baby clothes, baby blankets, burp cloths, a baby monitor, and more.

Two days later, I received a call about 1:30 pm. A man was looking for a wheelchair for one of his neighbors who had a stroke several days prior and could not walk. By coincidence (?) I happened to be in my car and only a few miles from the Mission House. By 2:00 pm, this kind neighbor picked up the wheelchair at the Mission House and was on his way to give it to his neighbor.

#### **MISSION HOUSE NEEDS:**

The congregational response for items needed in our Mission House has been overwhelming. Times are hard for many of us, but as we serve in the Mission House, we observe that so many in our community are struggling to survive day to day. The "guests" that come to the Mission House generally arrive at the door needing a variety of items. They leave with material possessions but also knowing they are loved and prayed for. All donations are helpful.

Linens - Sheets of all sizes, Comforters, bedspreads, towels Girls clothes - sizes 8 and up Boys clothes - sizes 10 and up Kitchen items - pots and pans, cooking utensils, flatware (does not have to be complete set), blender, microwave or hot plate Medical equipment - wheelchairs, knee braces


