# We Need To Believe the Gospel for Ourselves

Seeking new ways to reach our Tallassee community can be fulfilling and exciting, and it can also lead to discouragement and disillusionment. The reason we sometimes get discouraged in our ministry is because we fall into the trap of believing that while God exists, He is distant and absent in caring for us and coming to our rescue. We wouldn't admit it, but we tend to live as though the healing of the world is our responsibility, and that God is counting on us to heal it. And if that's what we believe, we're going to be discouraged, because in reality we can't heal anyone.

Yet what Jesus tells us is that we don't change the communities where we live, Jesus changes the communities where we live. Listen to Jesus quote Isaiah as He begins His ministry:

> "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to proclaim good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim liberty to the captives and recovering of sight to the blind, to set at liberty those who are oppressed, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor." —Luke 4:18–19, Isaiah 61.

Jesus is the one who brings good news, proclaim liberty, and to set at liberty those who are oppressed. So we're the participants in His kingdom, not the kings. Jesus advances the mission, not us. The invitation posed to us is to step into His kingdom, to believe the gospel, and to serve Jesus the Servant-King.

When we talk about believing the gospel, that's what we mean. And we will thrive in our ministry and outreach when we absorb the gospel of Jesus ourselves, and simply obey as Jesus transforms His city of Tallassee!

## Estelle Lockwood Ladies' Circle


The Estelle Lockwood Circle is starting back in September.
