The Bible is full of altar-building. From Noah when he first steps off of the ark to David buying a threshing floor that would end up being the location of the temple, God's people have built altars. They built the altars when God moved in their lives. Sometimes the altar was in response to God speaking. Sometimes the altar was in response to God giving guidance. Sometimes the altar was in response to God working a mighty act of salvation. In each case, the altar was built when God brought deep change in the lives of his people.

Altars have always represented change. They are the places where we worship God by thanking Him for what He has done. They are the places where God speaks to us and transforms our spirits and our hearts. They are the places where we surrender our lives to God and devote ourselves to obey Him in everything.

And of course, in the New Testament we find that Jesus has become like a living altar for us. Jesus became the place where hurting people, where lost people, could come and encounter the presence of God. Jesus is still doing that today. Even when our lives are filled with chaos, disappointment, pain and death, Jesus offers restoration and transformation, and that comes most deeply when we surrender ourselves completely to Him.

During the season of Lent we will be focusing on how we can make our lives an altar to God, so that we can experience anew the transformed power of a life surrendered to God.




